Keep your Pets Safe this 4th of July

- Resist the urge to take your pet to fireworks displays. Many pets become frightened and anxious because of loud noises or crowds.
- Keep your pets indoors at home in a sheltered, quiet area. Some animals can become destructive when frightened, so be sure to remove any items your pet could destroy as well as items that could be harmful if chewed. Leave a television or radio playing at normal volume to keep your pet company while you're attending Fourth of July picnics, parades, or other celebrations.
- Do not leave pets unattended outside under any circumstances. In their fear, pets who normally wouldn't leave the yard may escape and become lost.
- Keep food and alcoholic beverages out of your pet's reach. Alcohol and certain foods and drinks – onions, chocolate, grapes, raisins, coffee, and others – can be extremely dangerous when ingested by pets.
- Make sure your pets are wearing identification tags so that if they do become lost, they can be returned promptly. Be sure to check that your pet's tags include your correct contact information. Animals found running at-large should be taken to the local animal shelter, where they will have the best chance of being reunited with their owners.

They think she would do best as an only cat, and would love to hear from her new parents about how well she is doing. They visited Grace at the shelter EVERY day after work to see how she is doing, and to let her know that she had not been forgotten! They are true Harbor Heroes.
